Technical

Main Propulsion: Each propeller is driven by a double wound 3-phase synchronous motor with 4-bladed bronze propellers of submerged pod type. The motors are mounted directly on the propeller shaft inside the pod. The three propellers are arranged so that the center propeller is a pushing non-azimuthing Fixipod type and the two wing ones are of pulling azimuthing Azipod type steering propellers.
