The Bridge: The Bridge will be located on Deck 8, some 26 metres above sea level, where the deck officers will have an unobstructed view for navigation.

The Bridge will have a span of 36 metres and will be equipped with the latest navigational aids that, together with the trained watch-keepers, will ensure a safe voyage for all guests. In addition to communication equipment, the bridge will house displays for radar, sonar, speed and manoeuvring information. Close circuit television displays will be used to monitor all areas of the ship to maintain safety.
